

President's Report

In May 2019 the Williamstown Wolves Baseball Club was in fine shape when I became President. The outgoing President was Daniel Chircop, who had served three years at the helm. Thankfully Daniel remains a dedicated member of our club's leadership group and has continued to manage the sponsor portfolio and our international players. It takes a lot of work to run a happy well-organised club and we are fortunate to be in the position where there is no shortage of volunteers with a huge array of skills to contribute. Our club has an amazing culture and our dedicated volunteers reign from not only our current playing group and their families, but equally from our past players and their families, many of which are Life Members. We were able to acknowledge and celebrate our Life Members and our sponsors at our Life Members Day in February with a great attendance and plenty of sunshine. It has been a privilege and a pleasure to work with everyone at WWBC and contribute to a club that was established way back in 1908. While our current committee members have all agreed to be available for re-election for this coming season, we all acknowledge that our custodianship is only temporary and so one of our ongoing projects has been to put in place systems and policy to facilitate a clear and easy transition plan for future committees. Initiatives in this plan include position-based generic email addresses, online accounting software, and a new club website with comprehensive functionality on an easy to use platform. The website will also become a secure container for our clubs recorded history.

We have achieved a lot in the past year both on and off the field. We have received \$6000.00 in a series of small grants from Hobsons Bay City Council and the State Government and have hosted three successful (and fun) club fundraisers; a Bunning's BBQ, a movie afternoon at The Sun Theatre in Yarraville, and a (wooden) Horse Racing Carnival at our clubrooms. A small profit was achieved from the sale of masks and gators in team colours. We have introduced EFTPOS in our canteen, and will be launching our new website in September. Our club has registered with the Australian Sports Foundation to enable tax-deductible donations to our club and we intend on launching a fund raising campaign shortly to assist with equipment and the purchase of a second pitching machine for the new hitting tunnel. We were hoping this initiative would be firmly embedded within in-season play though like all plans we have had to adjust.

The end goal of our Club is to be promoted to Division 1 and we came very close this year. A Division 2 club is eligible for promotion if they field six junior teams, which we did, and then the 1's achieve either top spot on the home and away ladder or win the premiership flag. We finished second after spending many weeks on top and undefeated, and while all four senior teams made finals, which is a fantastic result, none brought home their respective premiership flags. Even so our playing group is in a strong position under the stewardship of Club Coach Aaron Green who celebrated 400 games mid season and we are very pleased Aaron is staying on for his third consecutive summer as a playing Club Coach. In the past we have missed promotion because we struggled to field the required number of junior teams. This year our Junior Coordinator Kim Hoy, who was awarded our Club Person of the Year, along with Sarah Le Fevre and Ray Baker, ensured we had a strong junior program alleviating this concern. A major initiative of our junior program was our inaugural winter junior participation, which Kim and Sarah introduced with great success. The winter program has proved to be an important factor in underpinning our summer juniors.

Like everyone I am greatly looking forward to getting back to baseball and we have a lot to look forward to.

Baseball and the COVID-19 global pandemic

It would be remiss of me to not acknowledge the significant impact the COVID-19 global pandemic has had on our club and our sport. Summer season was completed and we were fortunate to hold a slightly modified Junior Presentation Day just a couple of days prior to the first social lockdown that was put in place by the State government. Our Senior Presentation Day was postponed and then held in digital instalments during July and early August. With a great deal of conjecture surrounding the unfolding pandemic by Baseball's peak bodies and local and state governments, the Winter 2020 competition was eventually abandoned altogether. While WWBC does not participate in senior winter baseball many of our senior players move around to other clubs during winter so this has impacted their baseball life significantly. Last year was WWBC's junior inaugural winter competition and with two teams of fifteen players each we were confident in fielding three teams this year. Our juniors managed to return to training for just three weeks mid year before further lockdowns, where around forty children participated and were able to reconnect with their friends and make some new ones, albeit for a short time. It may well be that this coming summer is impacted by COVID-19 in some manner yet to be realised but we are well placed to meet these challenges. Kristie Middleton the Chief Executive Officer of Baseball Victoria has done a wonderful job during these unprecedented times supporting our club and the league with a comprehensive and timely approach to our current environment, with a view to facilitating a return to activity as soon as it is possible to do so. At a club level Vice President Sarah Le Fevre has been appointed our COVID-19 Compliance Officer and has all of our support to navigate a return to activity in line with government directives as they unfold.



This year we welcomed some new members to the committee. And for the first time that I can remember all 4 senior teams played finals.

The 1sts, 2nds and 4ths all made the Grand Finals but unfortunately, we were unable to take out the premierships. Unfortunately, the 3rds were knocked out in their 1st finals game. As a consequence, the club will remain in division 2 again next season. The club still endeavours to gain promotion to Division 1. We had a great import in Kevin Desmedt. Dennis Neal was able to extend his visa and play with us again as a local. This gave us 3 quality pitchers along with Jayde Thorne.

I would like to thank Kim Hoy and Sarah Le Fevre for their time and efforts in running our junior program during the winter season. We had hoped to continue it this winter but the pandemic put an end to that. Kim and Sarah were able to run a few junior training sessions on a Saturday morning with an excellent turn out of junior players.

Special thanks to Les Flower for all his work keeping the ground well maintained. And also the OFC with all their work in improving facilities around the ground. Special thanks to Ray Baker for his hard work with seeing that a new batting tunnel will be built and ready for next season.

Personally, I would like to thank everyone who supports the training night bbq's and all the profits from the bbq's were transferred in to the club account. Going forward we need players to honour the canteen and umpiring rosters and not leave it to others to fill in for your non-attendance.

Williamstown Baseball Club Annual Report 2019-2020

Treasurer's Report

The 2019/2020 season saw the club maintain the strong financial management and momentum gained last year with a reported Net Profit of \$11,658. This was a \$1,123 increase over the previous year (\$10,535).

This momentum is underpinned from continued strong support through both financial donations and general maintenance around the Club. The financial performance excluding donations was still a profit of \$1,170 meaning our Club has continued from last year in being self-sufficient, which is our minimum aim.

Overall income for the club went up from \$61,552 in 2018/19 to just over \$69,000 in 2019/20 (excluding Grants). Expenses also increased by about the same amount; expenses in 2018/19 were \$51,0166 and in 2019/20 expenses were \$58,677.

Player Fees continue to be our single biggest source of income so maintaining a strong full playing list is essential to club finances. The Canteen/Bar returned a profit of \$12,938 against a turnover of \$19,237. This is a significant increase over last year which is attributed to the introduction of EFTPOS payments being accepted at the canteen. Sponsorship continued to be an important source of income with a profit of over \$7,000 after expenses.

This year saw the first running of a Junior Winter Program by the club with an exceptional effort being put in by the Junior Committee. While the club would have been happy to underwrite the program in its first year the Winter Program delivered a profit in excess of \$2,000.

This year also saw the continued work being done in progressing the building of the hitting tunnel. The Club has sourced grants and donations totalling \$87,000 against an estimated build cost of \$92,000. The Club has contributed an additional \$5,000 from surplus funds into the Building Fund. Additional funding is being sought through grants, sponsorships and donations to go towards equipment in the new hitting tunnel.

Our Club's strong financial position has never been more important with what could be a significant financial impact to the 2020/21 season due to the impacts of COVID19. This may present challenges in the size of the playing list, reduced sponsorship and reduced canteen/event income. Despite these challenges, due to the fiscal management of the Club, I'm confident the we can meet our expenses in the coming season and emerge in a sound financial position on the other side.



Grounds and Facilities Report

I am pleased to report on the maintenance of the Martin Bowyer Senior Field, the Ray Baker Junior Field, and associated facilities for the 2019-2020 year.

With the club's great promotion numerous junior teams were nominated which required more diamonds to be marked weekly. This was duly completed and thanks to the players and coaches who assisted in the clean up after games.

Many may know of the Old Farts Committee this is a group of ex-players; Ray Baker, Laurie Treadwell, Roger Twist, Alan Moloney, John Humphries and myself. This group spends countless hours maintaining the fields, equipment and facilities throughout the year. Without their expertise and labour our diamonds would not be in the pristine shape you see them each week.

During the year we purchased a new Hack Attack pitching machine. These devices are reported to be among the best pitching machines in the world and will be a great asset to the club now and in the future, particularly when the new hitting tunnel is completed. We also purchased a new cylinder mower similar to those used on golf/bowling greens this also has enhanced the grass and presentation of the fields.

Other major works were completed on the existing hitting tunnel ensuring it was safe and secure for this year. We look forward to continuing the effort in the forthcoming season. We are always looking for volunteers to assist in diamond marking etc during the week for junior diamonds. Please contact the Junior Coordinator if you have sometime. Training will be provided. It is not hard work but as us Old Farts are not getting any younger and we need to ensure there is backup as required in the future.

Hitting Tunnel Project

Our major project for the past year has been the planning and construction of a new hitting tunnel at Greenwich Reserve adjacent to our clubrooms. In 2018 Ray Baker, Mark Chircop our Treasurer, and myself first pitched to the Hobsons Bay City Council for funding, so to see it finally taking shape is wonderful. This is the first major building project our club has seen since the 1970's, when our clubrooms were first built and Ray was just a young baseball player. I'd like to take this opportunity to thank Hobsons Bay for their contribution of \$20,000, and to the Victorian State Government for their subsequent \$20,000 contribution. This project has also already benefited from many hours of volunteer labour and the donation of materials. The project group is managed by Ray Baker, who is supported by the other members of the self named 'Old Farts Committee' (they even have their own logo and uniform), being Leslie Flower, Alan Moloney, Roger Twist, John Humphries, Laurie Treadwell along with Izzy Finn (architectural drawings), David (Murph) Le Fevre and James Harrison (geotechnical investigation and report), Rob Di Blasi (engineering and structural drawings), Steve Benic (excavation), Chris Jackson (lighting), and Andrew Sadler (concreting).





















Senior's Report

The future is bright at the Wolfdome! This season we had 27 players suit up for the 3's, half of which played 8 or more games 9, of those 27 were under 20 years old and 4 were under 16!

It would be pretty easy to say from the numbers above that the 3rds had a good year on the field with a young core that will only improve. What the numbers don't necessarily say is just how close we were to being the best in the league while also being the youngest in the league. A couple of tight losses in the first series of the season against Doncaster was the difference between 3rd and 1st place.

I'll make continued references to the youth in the team because it cannot be undersold how vital they were to the success of the team, and how vital they will be to the future of the club. Often playing 2 games a day, they bought an energy and a thirst for knowledge every game that was contagious. For the first time in a long time, an abundance of available players sometimes led to limited playing time for the kids, but they all handled it with a maturity beyond their years and never dropped their head. The support the 3rds received by all levels of the club was as good as I have experienced in my time as 3rds manager from the top down. It was fantastic to often have our President Michelle Sadler as a regular spectator, Aiden was a rock behind the plate and an important influence on the bench, and Andrew was never far away, always willing to coach a base or be an adult in the room (kids will still be kids after all), so thank you to the entire Sadler family. The entire coaching staff of the club can be credited with the growth of this team throughout the season - Greeny ran a club practice that was inclusive of all players, Dennis and Mike were always there running extra work specific to the juniors, and I'd like to make special mention of Jayde Thorne who we all know talks the talk, but the kids see he walks the walk and his passion for the game is evident for all to see.
