## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The summer season of 2021/2022 was again affected by social lockdowns due to the COVID19 pandemic. If anything, the season warranted a longer preseason than in previous years to reactivate our sport and recruit juniors and women, the later for what we hoped was a new women's program. Instead, social lockdowns meant that preseason was delayed and reduced to just two weeks. The decision to reduce preseason was to avoid cutting games from the fixture, as confidence abounded that the lockdown leading into the season would be the last, attributed to the achievement of widespread vaccinations. To comply with insurance stipulations with regards to avoiding injury of players due to the reduction of preseason training, all senior games prior to Christmas were limited to just seven innings but returned to normal in the New Year.

We were unsuccessful in fielding an inaugural women's team (in recent history), failing to register enough players to warrant a team, despite initial interest being at level that suggested otherwise. The lack of a meaningful preseason and inability to host a come and try day are factors in this outcome. Those that were interested were not prepared to play in a combined team, preferring to play for Williamstown only, mainly due to past connections with the club. The committee is motivated to try again and succeed in this endeavour for next summer.

Another significant aspect to this summer was the complicated dispute between the Baseball Umpire Association of Victoria and Baseball Victoria, which meant the absence or severe shortages in paid umpires for senior games. Many thanks to Justin Charles and Daniel Chircop for their willingness to umpire senior games on a volunteer basis. Fortunately, the dispute between the governing bodies, which revolved around insurance, was resolved by seasons end, so we can look forward to next season, relatively free of not only COVID19 complications but also from the lack of umpires.

Once the season was underway Kim Hoy resigned from her position of Junior Coordinator, as planned, and handed the reigns over to Sarah Le Fevre, along with establishing a Junior Sub Committee, with a smooth transition. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Kim for her exceptional sports administration support. We live in hope that Kim and her daughter Caitlin return to the Wolves at some point in the future. Significant contributors to the subcommittee, along with Sarah Le Fevre, are Jo Tyers, who has mad graphic design and procurement skills, Michelle Coote, who has a strong interest in coaching, and Sarah Bergin, who is a past Junior Coordinator and is involved in the Twins Charter.

Our supply of uniforms contract with Viva Global expired during this year and we negotiated to buy the remaining stock at a discount of 60%. We have already recouped a significant part of our outlay. With the help of Mitch Clement, we introduced a uniform and merchandise store on the club's website, offering a couple a modest discount on targeted items. The next step will be assessing the need to replenish stock and finding new suppliers.

#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

While player numbers were down slightly, this year we hosted several events, once the season was underway, with very good attendance. These included a Bunnings fundraiser BBQ, a Movie Fundraiser night at the Sun Theatre in Yarraville, and A Horse Racing Carnival Fundraiser at the club. Purely social events social events included a virtual golf night at Epic Arena and an International Beer (and pizza) Day. A highlight of our social events calendar, as always was our Life Members Day. This year attendance levels were unprecedented, with vintage uniform paying homage to our team of the century a huge drawcard. Past players and Life Members alike appreciated the effort our seniors went to in facilitating this initiative. Special thanks to Aaron Green, Club Coach, for his part in managing this successful contribution to a great club day.

This year we have had walls installed in our Hitting Tunnel, improving the protection from bad weather for its users. We have also purchased a new upright timber and glass display cupboard to house and display the club's perpetual trophies.

The committee has recently ratified a Strategic Plan, the development of which was facilitated by a collaboration with Leisure Networks, and supported by Moore Australia, an initiative of the Hobson's Bay City Council (HBCC). The Strategic Plan document is attached as an appendix to this annual report. It will serve as a guide for enhanced operations the incoming committee can follow to solidify and demonstrate the strength of our club's administration, imbuing confidence in the club by HBCC and other external partners.

While Wolfpack membership was down this year, we welcomed Luke Lawry of LL Installations as a major sponsor. Luke returned as a player in the Masters also and we thank him for his generous support. Part way through the season, Epic Arena, an indoor entertainment venue offering virtual golf amongst other amusements also sponsored our club, offering an indefinite supply of \$45 junior vouchers to hand out as encouragement awards each week to a player in each junior team. This is a wonderful initiative, and I would like to thank Nick Gray our Social Manager for his integral role in this outcome. Second Avenue Grocer continues to be a major support supplying all the club's bread roll requirements free of charge, and I would like to take this opportunity to thank them profusely for their long-term support they have shown our club.

Lastly, I would like to thank the committee, our volunteers, our players, and families, for their adaptability and resilience in these extraordinary times. Even amongst our small community the difference of opinions on matters outside our control regarding the pandemic and the umpires dispute are varied, and yet our members have demonstrated extreme respect and consideration to each other in all instances. I am very proud of the culture at WWBC, and the recent challenges have only strengthened our club.





## **SECRETARY'S REPORT**

During the year Kim Hoy decided to step down as Junior Coordinator but not before setting up a Junior Sub-Committee to help run the juniors. I would like to thank Sarah Le Fevre for taking over the duties of Junior Coordinator and Mitch Clement coming on board as Ground Manager.

The committee again decided to re-appoint Aaron Green as club coach. Although the start of the season was impacted by Covid again this year it wasn't as late as season it started in mid-November with the 1sts playing 21 games while the other teams played 14. Unfortunately, with injuries to our main starting pitchers early in the season and with midweek games every week after the Christmas break which took its toll on the pitching staff the 1sts & 2nds failed to make the finals again this year. But on the plus side both the 3rds & 4ths made the play-offs but were unsuccessful in winning the premiership. It was great to see so many juniors playing in the seniors.

We held the AGM via Zoom in May which was attended well & the committee continued to meet each month by Zoom.

Special thanks to Les Flower for all his work keeping the ground well maintained. And also, the OFC with all their work in improving facilities around the ground.

Personally, I would like to thank everyone who supports the training night bbq's and all the profits from the bbq's were transferred in to the club account.

This year we were able to have the Bunnings BBQ again with strict rules and guidelines in place we had a successful day. So, I would like to thank everyone who participated on the day especially a couple of junior parents who stepped in last minute to cover people who were unable to do their shifts due to Covid protocols.

I would like to congratulate all the trophy winners this year.

I would also like to thank Justin Charles who stepped and umpired 1sts games when we weren't supplied with official umpires. It made my job a lot easier knowing I could call on JC. While you have indicated that you have played your last game I sincerely hope we will still see you around the club whether it be to watch a game or in some sort of supporting role.

Going forward we need players to honour the canteen and umpiring rosters and not leave it to others to fill in for your non-attendance.





## TREASURER'S REPORT

The 2021/2022 was another challenging season with the start of the season delayed two months due again to COVID restrictions. This resulted in there being only 18 Senior games and 14 games for the 2s/3s/4s. Reduced games obviously impact our ability to raise revenue, and, to counter that, the committee reduced our expenditure accordingly.

Despite these challenges I can announce that we returned an operating profit of \$8,554.37 including Donations. The financial performance excluding Donations was a Loss of \$-818.93. While this is not ideal, we were still very close to being self-sufficient excluding donations which is the aim of the club (from a Financial perspective).

Overall income for the club went up from \$56,363 to \$58,964 while expenses were held even this year (\$50,410) compared to 2020 (\$50,515).

Combined Sponsorship (including the Wolf Pack Club) was down significantly from last year's record levels (\$14,000) to just (\$6,722). With our Major Sponsor, BMS Steel, not renewing for next year, the Club will need to concentrate significant effort in this area in the coming season. The Club continued to invest significant funds in our facilities with the addition to the Hitting Tunnel of Cladding around the walls at a cost of \$7,683. The Canteen continued to be our single biggest source of funds (outside of Player Fees) raising over \$7,000, while the highlight of our fundraising events this year was certainly the Willy Cup which was hugely successful as both a Social Function and in raising revenue for the Club.

Forecasts for the coming season have an expectation of increased coaching and import costs which will also present a challenge. Having said that, the Club is in a very strong position to be able to meet these costs while exploring new revenue streams.

This will be my last Financial Report as I step down as Treasurer and from the committee for the coming season. It's been a pleasure and an honour to work with this and preceding committees over the last 4 years. I thank them for their support and input to financial decisions made over that time. I am very comfortable in handing over to the incoming Treasurer as the Club is in the strongest position financially that it has ever been in.



## **EVENTS & FUNDRAISING**



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## **SENIOR PRESENTATION**

The 2021/2022 Senior Presentation was held at the Victoria Hotel in Yarraville on Saturday, 30th April. A highlight of this years presentation was when President Michelle Sadler, announced that the club was retiring jersey number 9, worn by Laurie Treadwell. Laurie's family (pictured) attended to witness Laurie's surprise. Laurie played a total of 850 games for Williamstown between 1970 and 2014. 329 games for the 1's, 126 games for the 2's, 104 games for the 3's, 90 games for the 4's, and 201 games for the Masters. In the lead up to Life Members Day in March of this year, Laurie donated two original jerseys to the club, which are now proudly displayed at the Greenwich Reserve rooms for prosperity.

This is only the second ever jersey retired by the club, with Les Flower's number 40 being the first to be retired in May 2019. Les played 760 games for Williamstown from 1962 to 2012. 212 games for the 1's, 214 games for the 2's, 205 games for the 3's, 8 games for the 4's, and 121 games for the Masters.
